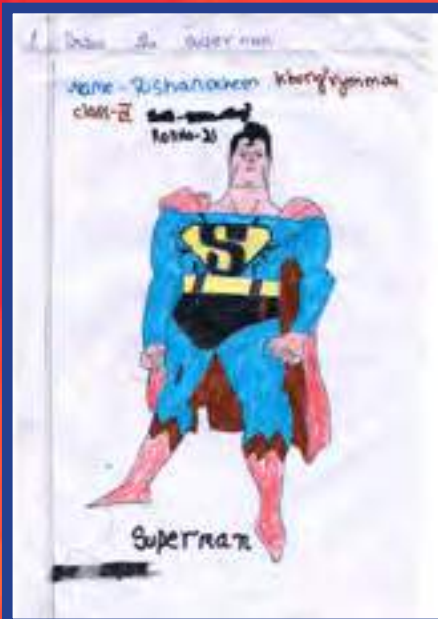

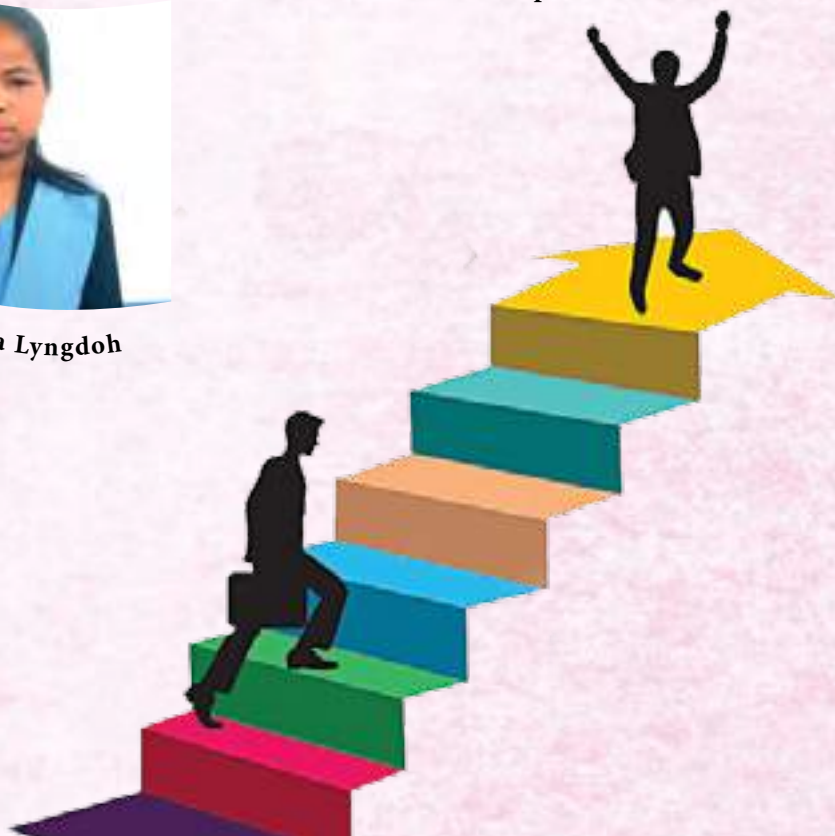

Good Shepherd Diary-2018

The year 2018 has swiftly gone by. There are a lot of things to reflect and ponder over and remind ourselves of the achievements and happenings. It was a great joy of being together and helping one another for achieving one common goal.

1. Inauguration of the Academic year

The academic year commenced on 7th February with a band of 30 teachers, three office staff, two helpers and 719 students. A meaningful prayer service was conducted by the hostel girls. Fr. George Jacob CSC, The Principal accorded a warm welcome to all. Students were sent home by 10.30 am and at 12.00 noon teachers had the first staff meeting of the year. Mr. Rocky was selected as the teachers' representative for the year 2018 and Ms. Santa Maria, the staff secretary.

To actualise the human resources to the optimum level, the school constituted different Committees such as Academic, Cultural, Discipline, etc. and house in charges were also appointed.

2. Nomination of SPL and ASPL

On 19th February, nominees for the post of SPL and ASPL were announced from Classes 12 and 10. The nominated candidates were scrutinised at the Principal's office for their eligibility. The Principal explained the rules and regulations, aims and aspirations that they should have if they are elected for the posts.

3. Election of SPL, ASPL and formation of Houses

On 21st February, the 8 candidates were given the opportunity to introduce themselves and speak few words during the morning assembly. Later in the day, the students voted for their candidates using ballot paper. After the lunch break a special assembly was conducted and Fr. George, the Principal declared the result. Pynsuklang Kharsahnoh and Iairibha Umsong were declared as SPL and ASPL respectively. After that, the entire school was divided into four houses so as to tap and develop the creativity and leadership qualities of the students. Each house selected their house captain and vice-captain for the smooth running of the house activities.

4. MBOSE Examinations Conducted

HSSLC and SSLC Examinations were conducted at Good Shepherd Higher Secondary School. The HSSLC and SSLC Examinations began on 6th and 7th March respectively. There were 87 HSSLC students from 3 schools and 267 SSLC students from 13 schools appeared for the Board examinations.

5. Regular events of the school

School Assembly, preparation of House Bulletin Board on various themes, staff meetings, managing committee meetings, unit tests, terminal examinations, Parents-Teachers meeting, coaching classes for class X and XII and various academic competitions were conducted throughout the scholastic year.

6. Secondary and Higher Secondary Results

May 25th was an important day for the school. On that day MBOSE result was declared. Out of 58 students had appeared in the higher secondary section 57 of them passed. The pass percentage was 98.27%. In the secondary examination, out of 57 students appeared, 55 of them passed with a percentage of 96.5%.

7. Achievements and Award

a. Eco-club Award

On 5th June 2018, Eco Club of our School was awarded the 3rd prize at the State Level by the State Council of Science Technology and Environment (SCSTE) for our new and innovative initiatives in addressing the environmental issues in the State. Shri. Conrad Sangma, the honourable Chief Minister of Meghalaya gave away the award of Rs. 2000/- and a sapling to plant in the school campus. Kudos to Eco-club.

b. Sci-Connect

The school participated in the preliminary written examination for Sci-Connect 2018 organized by the State Council of Science Environment and Technology (SCSTE) Shillong Meghalaya. Six of our students - Ethelbert Nongrum, Preciousstar Nongrum, Jessyca Warlarpah, Faustina Nongspung, Peacefully Rynjah and Ibansari Rynjah got selected to represent the State in the second round at Aizwal from 28th to 30th August 2018. Preciousstar Nongrum was selected to be part of the state team to participate in the finals held at Agartala.

c. Deepika Exam

Deepika Scholarship Examination was conducted on 29th September 2018. 180 Students appeared for this exam. Ms. Faustina Nongspung stood 3rd place at the National level. Most of them received gold medals, cash prize and certificates.

d. Reliance Foundation Football Tournament

Our school participated in the school level football tournament organized by Reliance Foundation. Good Shepherd reached the semi-finals of the tournament. Isharwer Mukhim of our school bagged the Golden Boot and Golden Ball award in the tournament and scored 18 goals for the team. Congratulations to all

In his speech, he appreciated Holy Cross fathers for their keen interest and the great contribution in the field of education.

The cultural evening was great excitement for the students. Mr. Olet Kharsahnoh, the Headman of Jongksha village was the chief guest. The presence of Fr. Mariaraj CSC, the Assistant Provincial of Holy Cross Fathers and Fr. Joe Paul CSC, the Secretary of Holy Cross Educational Foundation and all the fathers, sisters and teachers was a great encouragement to the participants. Third - Green House 254 points

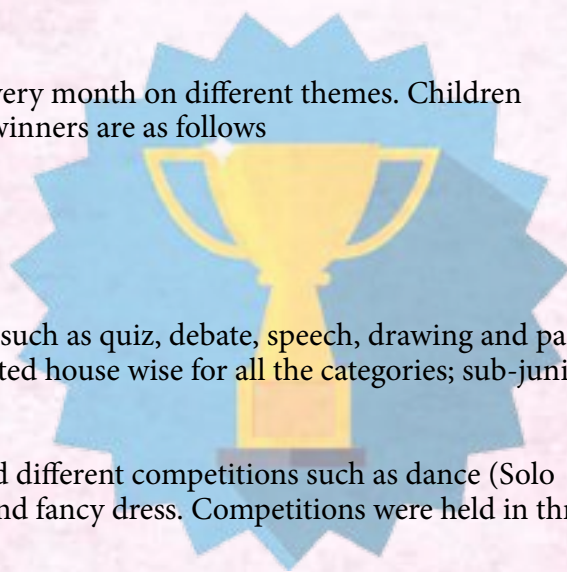
Fourth - Blue House 211 points
